



Craft Activity

Theme: Cars

Intro: A car is a vehicle that has wheels, carries people and moves using a motor or engine. They are smaller than trucks and buses.

Craft activity: Car Painting

Children will need: Toy Cars, paint, paper, small paint trays or plates

Instructions:

Place different coloured paints in each of the paint trays/plates. Roll the wheels of a toy car through the paint, and then roll across the paper. See how many tracks you can make, with all the colours.

Extension ideas: Try and mix the colours. What colours did you make? Cover a large table with paper to use the cars on.

Fact: There are more cars than people in the world.

Coordinator extension ideas and group time guide

Sensory activity:

Car Ramp sensory tray

You will need: Cardboard tubes, tape, tray, cars



Instructions: Cut cardboard tubes in half, and tape one end to the edges of a tray. Children can use the tubes as car ramps, zooming the cars up and down.

Outside Activity:

Using paper plates and paint, make Stop and Go “lollipop” signs to use outside. Children can pretend to be traffic controllers.

Group time ideas:

- Make traffic light cookies, by decorating a biscuit with icing, and adding red, yellow and green M & M's.
- Use masking tape to make road tracks on the floor/carpet.
- Play “Red Light, Green Light.” Use the “lollipop” to control the traffic. Children move around in a circle, and when the “lollipop” changes from green to red, the children stop.
- Reading books from the suggested list.
